Jessica Kahkoska is a Colorado and New York-based writer, dramaturg, and researcher. Projects include *In Her Bones* (Denver Center for the Performing Arts, 2020 Colorado New Play Summit) *The Death of Desert Rose* (with Elliah Heifetz, Dramatists Guild Foundation Fellowship, SBR Productions Commission), *Agent 355* (with Preston Max Allen, Chautauqua Theater Company New Play Workshop, Marion International Fellowship in the Visual and Performing Arts), *Letters To The President* (dir. Michael Bello, The Cooper Union), *Wild Home: An American Odyssey* (Notch Theatre Company, 2020 NEA ArtWorks Grant), and *NIA* (dir. Sarah Wansley, Upcoming at New Light Theatre Project's Darkroom Series). Born and raised in Colorado Springs, she has performed in seven productions at the FAC (most recently *Fun Home*), and recently collaborated on a 3x3 Creative Collaborations from Isolation project with Anita Rodriguez and Miguel Gandert. In Colorado, she has worked with the Denver Center for the Performing Arts, Lake Dillon Theatre Company, Theatre Aspen, Southern Colorado Repertory Theatre, North Fork Valley Creative Coalition, Creede Repertory Theatre, Athena Project, Colorado Environmental Film Festival, and Denver University. ABOUT ZEBULON PIKE

Zebulon Pike, in full Zebulon Montgomery Pike, was born on January 5, 1779 in Lamberton, New Jersey. He was an U.S. army officer and explorer for whom Pikes Peak in Colorado was named.

In 1805 Pike, then an army lieutenant, led a 20-man exploring party to the headwaters of the Mississippi River with instructions to discover the river's source, negotiate peace treaties with Native tribes, and assert the legal claim of the United States to the area. Pike traveled 2,000 miles by boat and on foot from St. Louis, Missouri, to Leech and Sandy lakes, in northern Minnesota. He erroneously identified Leech Lake as the river's source.

In July 1806 Pike was dispatched to the Southwest to explore the Arkansas and Red rivers and to obtain information about the adjacent Spanish territory. Pike established an outpost near the site of present-day Pueblo, Colorado, and then led his party northwest, where they encountered the Front Range of the Rocky Mountains. After trying unsuccessfully to scale the mountain peak later named for Pike, the party proceeded southward to northern New Mexico, where they were apprehended by Spanish officials on the charge of illegal entry into New Mexico. They were escorted across Texas to the Spanish—American border at Natchitoches, Louisiana, where on July 1, 1807, they were released.

Pike's report on Santa Fe, with information noting particularly the military weakness of the capital and the lucrativeness of the overland trade with Mexico, stimulated the expansionist movement into Texas. Pike served in the War of 1812, attaining the rank of brigadier general. He was killed in action during the attack on York. Pike died in present-day Toronto on April 27, 1813.
